CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

A. Operations Report

Chief Executive Officer Rashidi Barnes provided a summary of ridership for Transit Employee Appreciation Day. He reviewed the results of this program and future plans to continue this next year.

Mr. Barnes reported on the BB gun shootings happening to Tri Delta Transit's bus fleets. Mr. Barnes gave a map as a visual aid showing where these shootings occurred. Mr. Barnes reported that Tri Delta Transit will be reaching out the Chiefs of Police and asking for support in beginning conversations on what action can be taken or any preventative measures.

Mr. Barnes reported on the MTC Commission meeting that occurred earlier this day April 26, 2023. He shared the entire presentation with the board. Mr. Barnes reviewed the transit fiscal cliff and ridership advocacy work that is being done. The state budget is being released in 6 weeks.

Mr. Barnes gave a summary on the visit from Congressman John Garamendi's local office to the Tri Delta Transit facility on April 11, 2023.

A. Authorization for Shop Truck Purchase

Manager of Administrative Services Joe Chappelle requested the approval for purchase of two shop trucks.

Director Craft voiced concern around spending money outside of the jurisdiction. Director Bryant asked what the boundaries are around purchasing these trucks. It was reported that staff solicited inside Tri Delta Transit's jurisdiction and vehicles were unavailable within the timeframe that the purchase was needed. In addition, the state contracts are very time sensitive and it was determined that due diligence was taken in purchasing the vehicles within Tri Delta Transit's jurisdiction, however not losing the funding has taken priority.

Passes are available at Tri Delta Transit front office and on-line at 511cc.org/youthpass.

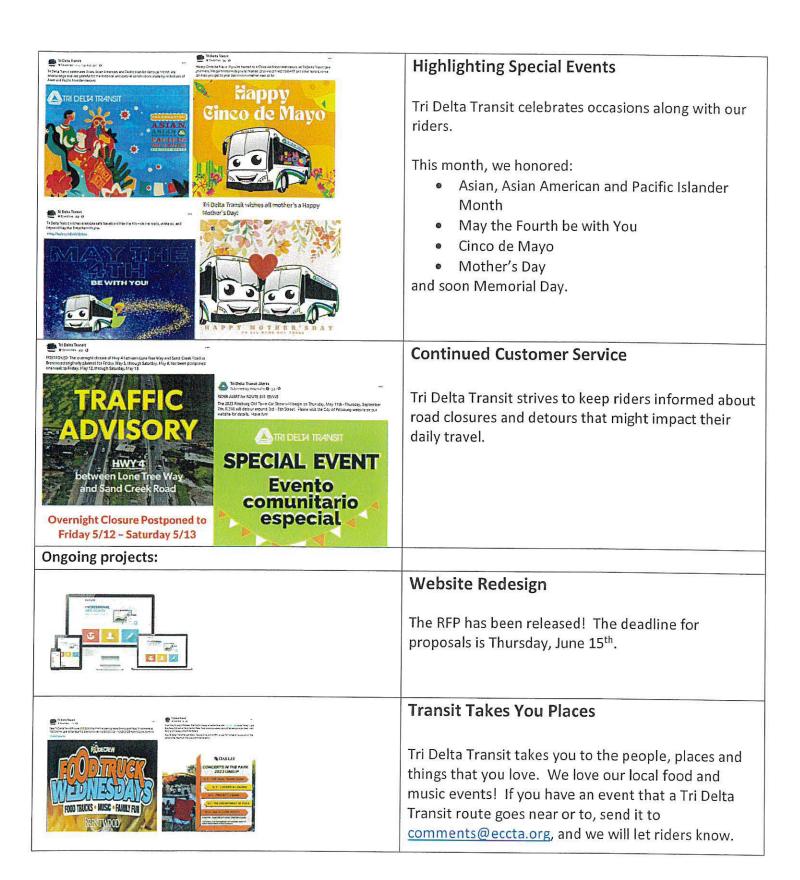

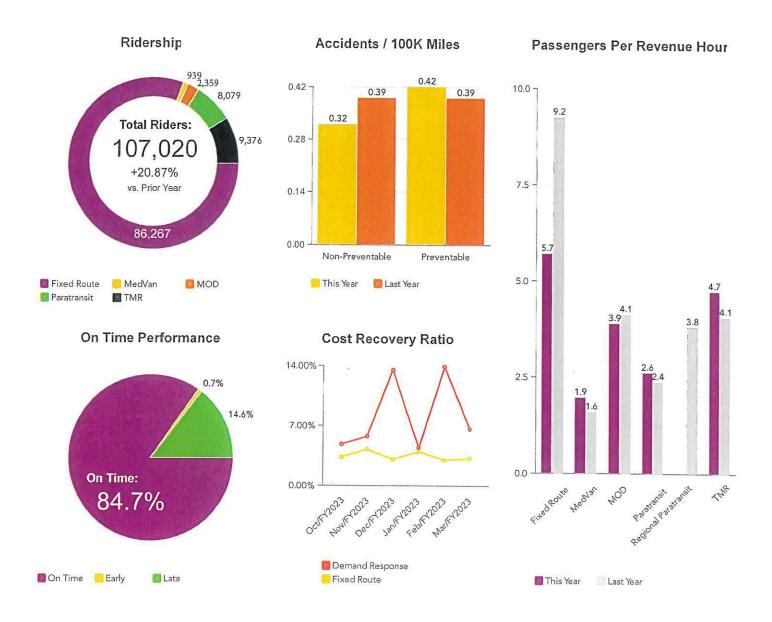

TRI DELTA TRANSIT Performance Summary



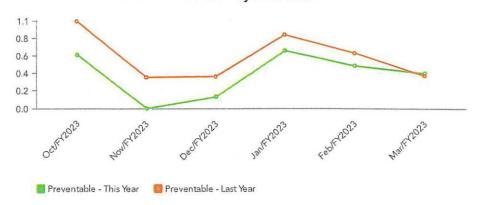


TRI DELTA TRANSIT Safety Performance

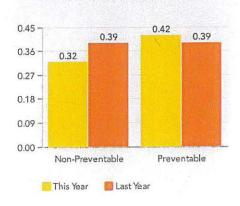

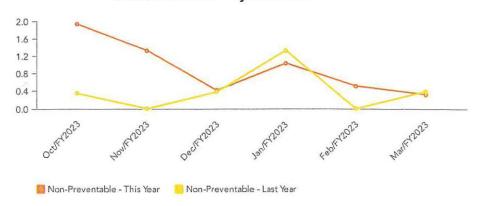
Preventable Accidents Per 100,000 Miles Last Six Months - System Wide

Non-Preventable Accidents Per 100,000 Miles Last Six Months - System Wide



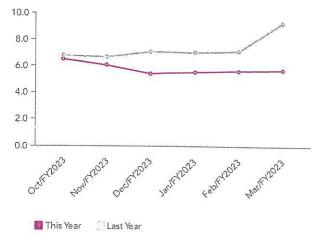

Background

The Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) is one of several programs that are part of the Transit, Affordable Housing, and Sustainable Communities Program established by the California Legislature in 2014 by Senate Bill 862. The LCTOP was created to provide operating and capital assistance for transit agencies to reduce greenhouse gas emission and improve mobility, with a priority on serving disadvantaged communities. Approved projects in LCTOP will support new or expanded bus or rail services, expand intermodal transit facilities, and may include equipment acquisition, fueling, maintenance and other costs to operate those services or facilities, with each project reducing greenhouse gas emissions. For agencies whose service area includes disadvantaged communities, at least 50 percent of the total moneys received shall be expended on projects that will benefit disadvantaged communities.

This program will be administered by Caltrans in coordination with Air Resource Board (ARB) and the State Controller's Office (SCO). The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is responsible to ensure that the statutory requirements of the program are met in terms of project eligibility, greenhouse reduction, disadvantaged community benefit, and other requirements of the law.

ECCTA is an eligible recipient for Low Carbon Transit Operations Program funds. We are prepared to file a FY23 LCTOP capital project application for \$867,656 with Caltrans at this time. And are seeking board approval.

Staff recommends that the FY23 LCTOP funds available to us be applied to a three-year capital rollover project to provide the local funding match for the hydrogen fueling station.

Background

The Mills-Alquist-Deddeh Act (SB 325) was enacted by the California Legislature to improve existing public transportation services and encourage regional transportation coordination. Known as the Transportation Development Act (TDA) of 1971, this law provides funding to be allocated to transit and non-transit related purposes that comply with regional transportation plans. The TDA provides two funding sources:

- 1. Local Transportation Fund (LTF), which is derived from a ¼ cent of the general sales tax collected statewide.
- 2. State Transit Assistance fund (STA), which is derived from the statewide sales tax on gasoline and diesel fuel.

The State Board of Equalization, based on sales tax collected in each county, returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's LTF. The STA funds are appropriated by the legislature to the State Controller's office. The Controller's office then allocates the tax revenue, by formula, to planning agencies and other selected agencies. Statute requires that 50% of STA funds be allocated according to population and 50% be allocated according to operator revenues from the prior fiscal year. The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) is the transportation planning agency for the Bay Area and administers TDA and STA funds for the region.

ECCTA's Responsibilities

- applies for an annual allocation of TDA and STA funds through MTC each year;
- uses TDA funds for general operating purposes, including amounts statutorily directed to paratransit services;
- obligates an amount of these TDA funds for capital projects and as a required local match for other capital funds obtained when necessary;
- applies for an annual STA allocation through MTC simultaneously with the TDA application; and
- uses the STA funds received for general operating purposes in much the same way that TDA funds are used.

Application Process

ECCTA submits an annual TDA/STA application to MTC. A resolution adopted by the governing board is required.

Requested Action

Adopt Resolution #230524B which authorizes the Chief Executive Officer or their designee to file an application with the Metropolitan Transportation Commission for the FY2023-2024 allocation of Transportation Development Act and State Transit Assistance funds.

RESOLUTION # 230524B AUTHORIZATION OF FILING FOR TDA and STA FUNDING

Resolution #230524B authorizes the Chief Executive Officer or their designee to file an application with the Metropolitan Transportation Commission for the allocation of Transportation Development Act and State Transit Assistance funding.

WHEREAS, TDA funds from the Local Transportation Fund of Contra Costa County and STA funds will be required by applicant in Fiscal Year 2023-2024 for administering and operating Fixed-Route and paratransit services for the public of Eastern Contra Costa County; and

WHEREAS, the Eastern Contra Costa Transit Authority is an eligible applicant for TDA and STA funds pursuant to PUC §99260;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chief Executive Officer is authorized to execute and file appropriate TDA/STA applications together with all necessary supporting documents with the Metropolitan Transportation Commission; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission in conjunction with the filing of such claims; and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission be requested to grant the allocation of funds specified in the applications and supporting documents.

The proposed, balanced and fully-funded FY2023-2024 operating and capital budget was developed using projected service levels, revenue sources and planned projects.

Operating Budget Components

Operating Revenue

Operating revenues are divided into the following categories:

- 1. Non-Fund Operating (fares, advertising sales, BART DR contract)
- 2. Federal Operating Assistance
- 3. Transportation Development Act (TDA) and State Transit Assistance (STA) funds
- 4. BART Feeder Bus (STA)
- 5. Regional Measure 2 (RM2 Bridge Toll Revenues)
- 6. Measure J (County ½ Cent Transportation Sales Tax)

Operating Expenses

Operating expenses are divided into the following categories:

- 1. Purchased Transportation (Transdev operations contract and Mobility On-Demand)
- 2. Materials and Supplies (fuel, parts, tires, and other materials and supplies)
- 3. Salaries and Benefits
- 4. Services (professional and technical services, temporary help and contract maintenance service)
- 5. Casualty and Liability
- 6. Utilities
- 7. Taxes (property and diesel fuel tax)
- 8. Miscellaneous (dues, subscriptions, travel/meetings and advertising)

Operating Budget Process

The operating budget is primarily driven by the projected miles, hours and passengers for each mode of service. From that point, everything else is derived from actual expenses such as purchased transportation, fuel, parts, tires, insurance and taxes.

Revenues

- The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) issued their annual estimate and proposed apportionment and distribution of funds. Additionally, the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) apportioned STA and Measure J operating funds for FY2023-2024. Those revenue estimates were used as a guide to create the proposed budget for FY2023-2024 operating and capital projects
- The previous fiscal year-to-date average fare per passenger was used to calculate fare revenue (\$1.00 for fixed-route, \$1.77 for demand response and \$25.81 for MedVan)
- Federal operating revenues include our regular apportionment of ADA operating assistance and also include additional general operating assistance from Federal formula funds

Expenses

ECCTA's budgeted expenses are based off of the current year actual expenses with the following adjustments:

- Purchased Transportation beginning July 1, 2023 the operations contract will have a 5% increase to the fixed annual cost and to the variable cost. The variable cost will increase from \$58.68 to \$61.61 per service hour.
- Materials and Supplies The increase is mainly attributed to maintenance parts and tires and tubes costs.
- Salaries and Benefits staffing levels has decreased due to the elimination of the transition officer positions. Similar to last year, there is an 8% increase in wages for cost of living adjustment.
- Services Assumes a 10% increase from prior year.
- Casualty and Liability based on actual costs for insurance from the Transdev operations contract and a 15% increase for other insurance premiums.
- Utilities there is slight increase in utilities due to the addition of two battery electric buses to the fleet.
- Taxes based on current property tax rate and projected diesel fuel usage.
- Miscellaneous accounts for the annual conferences and marketing initiatives.

The proposed operating budget is \$35,732,994

Capital Budget

The capital budget projects are either fully-funded with TDA capital funding or the TDA capital funding serves as a local match to another fund source. Here are the proposed projects for FY2023-2024:
