#### **CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT**

#### A. Operations Report

Chief Executive Officer Rashidi Barnes reported on meetings with MTC to discuss funding. These meetings included multiple small operators from around the Bay area.

Mr. Barnes gave an update on the most recent occurrences of ECCTA vehicles and staff affected by BB gun shootings.

Mr. Barnes reported that he attended the welcome reception for LMC's new President along with many local officials. Mr. Barnes also gave a reminder that there is no November board meeting and recognized Leeann Loroño, Manager of Customer Service and Marketing for all of her hard work with events and making sure that TDT is well represented at local events.

#### ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

#### A. Marketing Policy Updates

Manager of Customer Service and Marketing Leeann Lorono gave an update on the current advertising policy. Ms. Lorono then gave an example of changes in the proposed new advertising policy that will replace three separate advertising policies currently in place.

On motion by Director Williams, seconded by Director Craft, ECCTA Board members approved resolution #231025A authorizing the proposed comprehensive ECCTA Advertising Policy to replace the three separate advertising policies previously adopted by the board, carried by the following vote:

#### B. Clipper Bay Pass Phase 2 Agreement with MTC

Manager of Customer Service and Marketing Leeann Lorono gave a summary on the Clipper Bay Pass program and the distribution of the program during phase 1. Ms. Lorono then gave the parameters and summary of the Clipper Bay Pass Phase 2 agreement with MTC. Further details and data will be given as the program continues regarding fare and ridership.

On motion by Director Bryant, seconded by Director Williams, ECCTA Board members approved resolution #231025B approving ECCTA to participate in the regionwide Clipper Bay Pass program and authorized the Chief Executive Officer to sign the Clipper Bay Pass Phase 2 Participation Agreement for program commencement on December 1, 2023, and continue no later than June 30, 2026, carried by the following vote:

#### C. One Seat Demonstration Project Extension

Mr. Tran expressed how transportation for these eligible customers used to operate prior to the project, and how well-received the One Seat program has been since its implementation. Mr. Tran reported new developments to this program including new tickets and a mobile app.



The full campaign and new schedules will go out early January in advance of the January 15<sup>th</sup> change.




#### **Sharing News and Information**


