Questions and Answers

Q: Can entities bid if they currently hold a C-10 license but are in the process of obtaining an EVIP certification?

A: Yes. However, as the EVIP certification is a requirement of the Carl Moyer grant agreement, ECCTA considers the contractor's ability to acquire EVIP certifications for its electricians to be a matter of the contractor's capability and capacity to do the project.

Therefore, if contractor's are unable to provide the applicable EVIP certification numbers to ECCTA by **5:00 p.m. on Monday, February 23,** the contractor will be determined to be non-responsible and ECCTA will award the contractor to the next responsive lowest bidder.

Q: How long do contractors have to complete the project?

A: The project is to be completed within six months from the date work is commenced.
